Welcome to the 2023-24 School Year!

We hope you have had a great summer and are as excited as we are for the start of the 2023-24 school year! We have been busy preparing a great school year for our students.

Student schedules will be mailed out on August 22. For those who already have accurate PowerSchool login information, student schedules will be available online at that time as well. In addition to your child's schedule, the mailing will include a grade level supply list (which is currently available online). An email will be sent with instructions on how to create a PowerSchool login to 6th grade parents and those new to the district. On the first day of school, students will also get a packet during homeroom, which will contain a student verification form that will need to be returned, field trip forms, a picture packet, and other pertinent information. The student verification form is extremely important as this ensures we have correct information to effectively communicate with you as parents.

At Petoskey Middle School, our staff prides ourselves in providing an excellent education for your child. It is our goal to partner with you to help your child learn and grow through these adolescent years. NEW IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Food Service

The Food Service Department, at the Public Schools of Petoskey, is pleased to announce that the Michigan School Meals program was signed into law for the 2023-2024 school year.

1) What does this mean?

School breakfast and lunch meals are FREE for all students attending public schools @during the 2023-2024 school year.

2) Do I still need to complete a free and reduced application?

YES! It is extremely important for all households to take a moment and complete the 100% confidential free and reduced application online at: Petoskey.familyportal.cloud © OR complete the paper application that will be sent home the 1st day of school.

3) Why do households need to complete a free and reduced application if meals are free?

The Public Schools of Petoskey will need to collect the information to ensure the district will continue to receive state and federal funding for education programs. Without this funding, the district will be denied additional support and services for our students.

STUDENT DEBT-

In order for all buildings to opt into this amazing program, ALL STUDENT DEBT IN FOOD SERVICE MUST BE PAID IN FULL.

Immunizations

State law requires that ALL students entering 7th grade be up-to-date on their immunizations in order to attend school. If you wish to obtain a waiver, you must get one through the Health Department. If you have any questions, call the Health Department at 347-6014.

Medications

If your student has prescription or non-prescription medicine that they take during the school day, a medication form must be completed for each medication and the medicine dropped off by an adult to the school office. A new form must be filled out each school year.

IMMUNIZATIONS REQUIRED FOR 7TH GRADE




Intramural Volleyball

Remember, sports physical for the 2023-24 school year must be completed no earlier than April 15, 2023.



DROP OFF / PICK UP PROCEDURES

The parent drop off and pick up procedure is an extremely important process that everyone must abide by. There has been an article in this newsletter for the past several months explaining the procedure, but it is important to review for the safety of all of our children. Parents should drop off and pick up students on the right side of the loop. The left side should be used for moving forward and is a no parking area. If you need to park for an extended time, please use the parking lot. It is also important to not obstruct Northmen Drive. Please see the picture below. The school parking lot is usually extremely busy and congested before and after school, and it will likely be an even greater challenge this year. To help maintain safety and traffic flow, we ask that you use the parent loop and parking lot accordingly. Also, remember that there is an alternate drop off location on the PHS side of Northmen Drive. Students dropped off there can walk to the Middle School through the tunnel.

No vehicles other than school buses are allowed in the bus loop. We appreciate your help in keeping our students safe.

Free & Reduced Application Information

On-line Application Form: Petoskey.familyportal.cloud

The Michigan School Meals program was signed into law in the Fiscal Year 2024 Michigan State School Aid Budget. The funding allows for all Public School students, grades Pre-K to 12, to eat breakfast <u>and</u> lunch for free, regardless of the household income.

It is extremely important for all households to take a moment and complete the 2023-24 Public Schools of Petoskey School Meals and Summer EBT Application for free and reduced meals form, even if you think you will not qualify. (One application per household; 100% confidential when completed online: Petoskey.familyportal.cloud OR the completed paper application can be mailed to: Petoskey Food Service, 1500 Hill Street, Petoskey, MI 49770.)

The Application for Summer EBT and Education Benefits with the Michigan School Meals Program collects information needed to ensure the school receives state and federal funding for education programs. Without this information, the Public Schools of Petoskey could lose important state funding for educational programs that our students are entitled to. These supplemental grants and programs have the potential to offer supports and services for our students including, but not limited to:

- Instructional
- Teaching supplies and materials
- Counselors and Social Workers
- School Nurses
- Professional Learning

We encourage every household to complete an application form, even if you think you will not qualify. The application information helps the district obtain grant funds to support learning in the district as stated above.

 - If you complete and turn in the paper application form; please DO NOT complete the on-line application.
- <u>Please use a blue or black pen</u> and NOT a pencil on the paper application form. Pencil applications will be denied benefits per USDA/Federal guidelines.

 - o 100% confidential

- Fastest processing time
- o Reduces paper, ink, stamps and mailing time
- ZERO chances of human error when processing the application
- Paper applications can get lost when the exchange happens between your children, teacher and secretaries
- Paper applications are not 100% confidential
 - Multiple people handle your application before it is sent to the food service department
- o Processing time is longer due to missing information

Charging Guidelines & Prices

Middle & High School: There will be no charging of a la carte items, second entrees or milk. Funds must be on accounts at the Middle & High School to purchase more than 1 (one) meal. There will be no exceptions.

Elementary School: There will be no charging of a la carte items, second entrees or milk. We will provide a cup for your child to fill with water if you do not have a drink packed in their lunch brought from home.

All students will be able to 1 (one) meal for breakfast and 1 (one) meal for lunch. 1 (one) milk is included in the breakfast and lunch meal if they choose to take it.

Breakfast and Lunch Prices: FREE for all students regardless of household income.

<u>A milk by itself is NOT a meal</u>. Students must take 3 of the 5 meal components to qualify for the Michigan School Meals Program.
