LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

- We have a budget
- The governor vetoed a bunch of line items, most notably \$40 million of appropriations of the Talent Investment Fund, part of Governor Snyder's "Marshall Plan" program.
- Another \$35 million came from by denying the foundation allowance increase allocated for charter schools.
- Finally, another \$35 million were funding for programs provided by non-governmental companies and other entities and were used by very few schools.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION

Ron Marshall, 810 Howard Street, Petoskey – noted that the electrical grid is moving to crisis point. The capacity and demand are getting closer together.
