 - o Provides guidelines and procedures to respond to incidents in an effective way
 - Large emphasis on incident command
 - Communication structures
 - Reunification guidelines
 - There are no recommendations for best practices
 - It is not an onsite review of what is currently in place
- Connected with Navigate360
 - Discussed with Brandon Wheeler and Ron Griffin
 - Will do an onsite review
 - Can make recommendations
 - Upload plan to an app on your phone
 - Scan each room
 - Risk assesment
 - Detailed reports indicating strengths, weaknesses, vulnerabilities
 - Can help us apply for grant monies
 - Upfront cost and then an annual cost per student
 - Codenity report is able to be uploaded into Navigate360
