- World Language
 - 2 credits World Language OR
 - 1 credit World Language and 1 credit Visual Arts, Performing Arts or Career Tech
 Ed course
- Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Applied Arts
 - o 1 credit
- Physical Education
 - o 1 credit OR
 - .5 credit waiver option: four years Marching Band OR two seasons of a school sport
 - o OR
 - 1 credit waiver option: four years Marching Band AND two seasons of a school sport
- Health
 - o .5 Credit
- Electives
 - o 2.5 Credits
- In compliance with the Michigan Department of Education, Michigan Merit Curriculum graduation requirements.
