# Public Schools of Petoskey Sinking Fund Presentation

## What is a Sinking Fund?

- Millage levy on real and personal property (all property within the district)
  - □ Must be approved by the voters of the district
  - □ Maximum mills that can be levied 3 mills
  - □ Maximum length of the levy is 10 years
- Allowable Sinking Fund uses:
  - Repair of school buildings
  - Technology upgrades (mostly hardware type of purchases)
  - Construction of school buildings
  - School security improvements
  - Purchase of real estate

### Public Schools of Petoskey Sinking Fund

- Voters approved 1.5 mill tax levy in 2019 which expires in 2026
- Generates approximately \$2,800,000 annually
- Revenues and expenditures are tracked in a separate fund to assure funds are used in compliance with applicable laws

  - High School main entrance
  - □ Roofing
  - □ Flooring
  - Boiler replacements
  - HVAC upgrades
  - Bathroom upgrades
  - Window replacements
  - Technology upgrades
