- There are students who are sole-less and unstable with bad home lives. These are the kids who need help.

• More can be done by partnering with parents. We are offering our help. Together, as a

collective parent group, we want to address our concerns about drugs, alcohol, fighting and bullying.

- There has only been one lockdown drill done this year and this is not enough.
