Why is this program needed?

So ALL Petoskey students have the opportunity to find success at Petoskey High with an alternative programming option.

- In the last 3 years, a yearly average of 13.33 students have transferred to Crooked Tree
- In the last 3 years, a yearly average of 10 students have transferred to online programs
- PHS At-Risk Team and staff members have identified 62 current Freshmen and Sophomores who may find Petoskey Polaris to be a good fit

How will Petoskey Polaris be Different than other Char-Em Alt. Ed. Programs?

- Transportation provided as Petoskey students
- Students are able to stay connected to PHS electives and extra curricular activities
- Special Education Teacher on-site for daily support
- Certified Teachers in all content area able to support students
- Maintain supports from PHS Counselors and Alcona Health Center

How Polaris Programming will Support Student

Polaris would create an educational setting with the following benefits:

- Fewer environments to navigate (1 main classroom space)
- Students focus on only 2-4 courses at any given time
- Flexible schedule-can adjust work and break time to meet individual needs
- Allows students to work at an increased pace if credit recovery is needed
- Certified Teachers support in all content areas
- Housed at PHS so students remain PHS students and are able to take advantage of electives/CTE, clubs, sports

Petoskey Polaris is an alternative learning environment where students can thrive. We leverage clear and consistent expectations with data to help students achieve. Polaris takes a whole-child approach to develop students socially, emotionally, physically, and academically.

Handbook Addendum

Petoskey Polaris will follow the Petoskey High School Handbook with the additional addendum

Targeted Population

- Students who have not been successful, academically, socially, or emotionally, in the PHS setting.
- Students who will have a path to graduation based on current credits earned.
- Students and parents that want to be a part of the program and agree to meet program [°]expectations.

Target Population for '24-'25

- Sophomore and Juniors.
- Per Byron Center, 7% of your student population is a good fit. Assuming 850 students at PHS approximately 30 students.

Curriculum = Hybrid Model (Online and In-Person)

Petoskey Polaris will adopt an online curriculum program (Edmentum) that can be modified by PHS staff. Students will work through the courses on-line and PHS Teachers will supplement each course with inperson components.

Example: Student is enrolled in Biology with Edmentum. PHS Certified Biology Teacher eliminates the online labs in the program, replacing them with in-person labs. The PHS Teacher assigned to Polaris 1 hour per day proctors in-person labs with students.

Pacing: Students will only be placed in 2-4 subject areas at any given time. Once a student finishes a course they will be placed in the next course. This allows student to focus on less courses at once and move through more than 6 courses in a semester if they are on a credit recovery pace.






Main classroom set-up: All students have a cubicle style desk

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
