We plan to mail student schedules by Wednesday, August 24th. For those who already have PowerSchool login information, student schedules will be available online at that time as well. ## **IMMUNIZATIONS FOR 7TH GRADE**

State law requires that ALL students entering 7th grade be current on their immunizations in order to attend school. If you wish to obtain a waiver, you must get one through the Health Department. To obtain a waiver, or if you have any questions, call the Health Department at 347-6014. Students that are not current on their vaccinations (or have a waiver on hand) will not be allowed to attend school.

When scheduling immunizations, remember that the COVID vaccine has to be given two weeks apart from other vaccines. We tell you this so you can plan accordingly to avoid a potential delayed start of the school year, should you choose to have your child receive the COVID vaccine or booster.

#### Attendance

If a student is going to be absent or tardy, a parent or guardian must call the attendance line at 348-2293 by 9:00 a.m., or the absence will be considered unexcused until we receive a phone call or note. If your child does not feel well and you are calling to excuse them from school, please include their symptoms in the voicemail so we don't have to call you back. Thank you for your help with this.

#### **Medications**

If your student has prescription or non-prescription medicine that they take during the school day, a medication form must be completed for each medication and the medicine dropped off by an adult to the school office. A new form must be filled out each school year.

#### SPORTS PHYSICALS

The submitted form must be the original form with the doctor's signature. You can obtain these cards in your middle/high school office prior to visiting your doctor for the sports physical. Remember, sports physical for the 2022-23 school year must be completed no earlier than April 15, 2022.

#### Support Staff

The Public School of Petoskey, including Petoskey Middle School, is in dire need of support team members. We have recently raised our Aide pay to \$14.50 an hour, and steps are available for longevity. There is also an opportunity to earn a \$500 bonus in December and again in June, pending attendance requirements are met. 10 leave days are also granted at the beginning of the year. #### **DROP OFF PROCEDURES**

The parent drop off and pick up procedure is an extremely important process that everyone must abide by. There has been an article in this newsletter for the past several months explaining the procedure, but it is important to review for the safety of all our children. Parents should drop off and pick up students on the right side of the loop. The left side should be used for moving forward. If you need to park for an extended time, please use the parking lot. It is also important to not obstruct Northmen Drive. Please see the picture below. The school parking lot is usually extremely busy and congested before and after school, and it will likely be an even greater challenge this year. To help maintain safety and traffic flow, we ask that you use the parent loop and parking lot accordingly:

The parent loop is a designated area set aside specifically for parents to drop off or pick up their children. The left lane is a no parking area. Traffic must be moving in the middle and left lanes. If you are walking your children inside or waiting for them in your vehicle, please use the parking spaces in the lot so as to not block traffic. Also, remember that there is an alternate drop off location on the PHS side of Northmen Drive. Students dropped off there can walk to the Middle School through the tunnel.

No vehicles other than school buses are allowed in the bus loop. We appreciate your help in keeping our students safe.
