

We Have Northmen DRIVE!

As a middle school staff we are not only driven to help our students grow academically, but we also work hard to help our students grow socially and emotionally. Our mission statement of "Learning in Growing Together" means something to our staff. We want to help our students grow into well-rounded and productive citizens!

Several years ago we instituted our Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) program to be more intentional in helping our students grow socially and emotionally. Homeroom is an important time during which we intentionally work on these DRIVE skills. Each day homeroom starts with the Pledge of Allegiance and review of daily announcements. On Tuesdays and Thursdays of most weeks, our staff covers a variety of topics to help set expectations and provide coaching and support for our students.

Some topics that are covered throughout the school year include the Full Value Agreement (Work as a Team, Be Safe, Speak Up), Northmen DRIVE (Determination, Respect, Integrity, Voice, Empathy), dealing with conflict, peer pressure, honesty, and leadership, among others. We are confident that this intentional focus helps each student more fully understand what these sometimes big topics really mean, while also fostering a community within the classroom.



We believe this intentional focus on the social and emotional needs of our students helps meet our mission of "Learning and Growing Together."

Immunizations

State law requires that ALL students entering 7th grade be up-to-date on their immunizations in order to attend school. If you wish to obtain a waiver, you must get one through the Health Department. If you have any questions, call the Health Department at 347-6014.

Medications

If your student has prescription or non-prescription medicine that they take during the school day, a medication form must be completed for each medication and the medicine dropped off by an adult to the school office. A new form must be filled out each school year.

SPORTS PHYSICALS

Only MHSAA sports physical forms will be accepted at middle/high school athletic departments. Forms are available on the MHSAA website, and our offices have cardstock forms available. The submitted form must be the original form with the doctor's signature. You can obtain these cards in your middle/high school office prior to visiting your doctor for the sports physical. Remember, sports physical for the 2022-23 school year must be completed no earlier than April 15, 2022.

DROP OFF / PICK UP PROCEDURES

The parent drop off and pick up procedure is an extremely important process that everyone must abide by. There has been an article in this newsletter for the past several months explaining the procedure, but it is important to review for the safety of all of our children. Parents should drop off and pick up students on the right side of the loop. The left side should be used for moving forward and is a no parking area. If you need to park for an extended time, please use the parking lot. It is also important to not obstruct Northmen Drive. Please see the picture below. The school parking lot is usually extremely busy and congested before and after school, and it will likely be an even greater challenge this year. To help maintain safety and traffic flow, we ask that you use the parent loop and parking lot accordingly. Also, remember that there is an alternate drop off location on the PHS side of Northmen Drive. Students dropped off there can walk to the Middle School through the tunnel.

No vehicles other than school buses are allowed in the bus loop. We appreciate your help in keeping our students safe.
